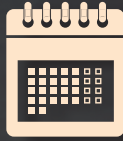
## WAYS

### to Display Your Travels

Scrapbooks and photo albums are great traditional ways to commemorate your travels, but so often they end up sitting on a shelf and forgotten. Instead, display your memories in plain sight! Here are some easy ways to fill your home with little reminders of all the things you've done and seen.

#### Monthly Memories

At the end of the year, compile your favorite photos and create a custom wall calendar to hang in your home or office. Each month will showcase new memories to reflect on. Custom wall calendars also make wonderful gifts to loved ones during the holidays.



#### Table Talk

Buy a coffee table with a glass tabletop to prominently display photos of your travels for all to see. Or, place a map under the glass with postcards of all the places you've been.



#### Bottle it Up

Take the beach home with you! Bottle up sand from your travels in a mason jar or a glass ornament, and add in some seashells and a photograph of your time spent by the waves. Place it on your mantle or somewhere you'll see it often.



#### From Coast to Coast

Using photographs, postcards or maps, create your own unique coasters. Order these at your local photo store, or create them yourself. Coat a plain white tile with a thin layer of Mod Podge, center a photo on top of it, and brush more Mod Podge on top. Hot glue felt on the back and you're done!

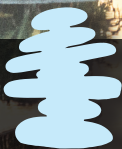
#### Out of the Shadows
